Gnasso

Gnasso is a balafon rhythm of the Bwa or Bwaba from Mali / Burkina Faso.

Gnasso (also found as: Gnjasso, pronunciation 'njasso') is the brewer and pourer of the locally brewed beer; "Dolo" also called "Tjappallo". The "Dolotière" is a Djoula-French word for the brewer. Gnasso is the Bwaba word for "dolotière". Gna = beer.

A rich client of the *cabaret* (café) normally gives away many rounds. However, one day he has no money. The *Gnasso* decides to give it for free that day. However, this makes the customer so tipsy that he becomes annoying and seriously insults her. (French expression: "moi, j'ai m'en fou"). The "dolotière" does not respond because the next day he returns - with money - to her. The song says:

Hey female beer brewer; what you say to me; I don't care! even if you give me free "dolo"; It makes no difference! even the whole audience insults me; I don't care!

(moi, j'ai m'en fou)






Pattern A1 simplified accompaniment




Pattern A2 accompaniment




Pattern B1 simplified solo accompaniment




Pattern B2 simplified solo accompaniment



Pattern B3 solo accompaniment






In this Pattern, the left hand plays, the right hand of Pattern A. That gives right the possibility many variations to play.


