

# K'Anouzo

*K'Anouzo (Kanouzo, Anouzo)* is a Bwa rhythm from Burkina Faso / Mali. Rhythm about the nicest girl in the village. In the Bobo language, "k'Anou" means; "I love you" and "zo": "child". *Anouzo* is also a girl's name. The meaning is therefore "child of love". The song has been modernized and released by

Ibrahim Keita ('Griot moderne') and his backing group *Nankama*. "The traditional background is that of 'the romantic adventure' in Bwaba land, as it has been sung since time immemorial." The group *Nankama*, 'les apporteurs de joie' (the bringers of joy), creates its music by mixing traditional rhythms with those of blues, salsa, Afro beat, reggae or funk.






Pattern B & var 1



variations 2 & 3




Pattern B
